- HEALTH Water, sanitation, child mortality, **LEAD**
- GLOBALISATION & TRADE: Inclusive & Equitable - Doha, Monterrey
Voluntary Environmental Impact Assessment
- NATURAL RESOURCES **Water, Land, Fish Stocks, KYOTO PROTOCOL.**
- CONSUMPTION & PRODUCTION.....



The Declaration states many targets and targets dates in different areas.

Areas like **Poverty** with concrete targets,

In **Health**, in this area the limitation in use of **lead** is mentioned.

In **Globalization & Trade Voluntary Environmental Impact Assessment** was emphasized.

In **Natural Resources Water, Land** and the **Kyoto Protocol** are mentioned.

10 Year Framework to Shift to Sustainable Production & Consumption

- Investment in Eco-efficiency, Cleaner Production
- Corporate Social Responsibility & Accountability:
Reporting
- Diversify Energy Supply - the **“OPEC of Renewables”**.
- Minimise Adverse Effects of Chemical Use:
Classification & Labelling, Eliminate Lead
- Prevent & Minimise Waste,
Maximise Re-use, Recycling, Eco-friendly Materials
- Voluntary Consumer Tools:

For **Consumption and Production** :

There was a 10 year framework mentioned, to shift to sustainable production and consumption, which requires various activities listed on this slide.

The Declaration: Implementation

- Finance, Debt relief
- Engagement by Industry
- Margot Wallstrom: the EU -
 - *“.....must continue to take the lead and translate political commitment into concrete action”.*
 - *i.e. more legislation, more “Voluntary Agreements”*



How to make it happen ?

The poor countries must have debt relief.

Industry must be engaged.
